FIELD TRIPS - Diane Lepkowski

**Field trips have been postponed due to concerns regarding the pandemic.

BIRD SIGHTINGS

Herb Myers heard a **Wood Duck** along Cub Run and spotted a **Chipping Sparrow** on a walk in Keezletown on March 25.

Mike Smith reported 12 Pine Warblers, Blue-headed Vireo, and Yellow-bellied Sapsucker on a hike at Runkles Gap on Massanutten Mtn on March 29. Mike had a yard Fox Sparrow on March 30 and Louisiana Waterthrush, Brown Thrasher, Yellow-bellied Sapsucker, Pine Warbler, Blue-headed Vireo, Ruby-crowned Kinglet, and Chipping Sparrow at his place in Elkton on March 31.

Mike and Evelyn Shank had 10 **Evening Grosbeaks** at their feeder west of Bridgewater on March 30. The grosbeaks have continued, with 12 reported on April 20 there, and a large flock continuing nearby at Karen Shank & family's place in Spring Creek as of this writing.

Mike Smith reported two **Double-crested Cormorants** on the Shenandoah River at Elkton on April 5.

Matt Gingerich reported a **Golden Eagle** at his place in Linville on April 5. The following day, Matt had **Vesper Sparrows, Grasshopper Sparrow, Savannah Sparrow**, and **Northern Harrier** at his place.

Greg Moyers reported a **Black-and-white Warbler** at Madison Run Fire Rd on April 6 and a **Black-throated Green Warbler** at Switzer Dam on April 7. Greg reported a **Common Loon** at Switzer on April 11 and a **Hooded Warbler** on a trail along Rt. 33 on the same date.

Herb Myers had all seven local woodpecker species at Starry Meadows near Singers Glen on April 9 – **Downy, Hairy, Red-bellied, Red-headed, Northern Flicker, Pileated**, and **Yellow-bellied Sapsucker**. On April 10, Herb reported **Louisiana Waterthrush, Pine Warbler**, and **Blue-headed Vireo** at Madison Run Fire Rd. On April 15, Herb reported a **Broad-winged Hawk** near Hensley's Pond on Massanutten Mtn. Herb had **Northern Parula, Blue-gray Gnatcatcher**, and **Louisiana Waterthrush** at Lower Highland west of Broadway on April 17.

Greg Moyers, Diane Lepkowski, and William Leigh reported **Blackburnian Warbler**, **Northern Parula**, and **Ovenbird** at Switzer Dam on April 17.

Mike Smith heard a Northern Bobwhite calling and saw Blue-winged Teal, Solitary Sandpiper, American Pipit, and Eastern Meadowlark at Leonard's Pond on April 20.

Diane Lepkowski reported two **Palm Warblers, Bonaparte's Gull**, and **Solitary Sandpipers** at Lake Shenandoah, and a **Sharp-shinned Hawk** at her home on April 21.

Doug and Sally Ruby had a **Red-headed Woodpecker** at their home on April 24. Diane Holsinger also had **Red-headed Woodpeckers** at her place in Timberville on the same date.

Greg Moyers reported **Great Crested Flycatcher**, **Red-eyed Vireo**, **Wood Thrush**, **Hermit Thrush**, **Red-headed Woodpecker**, **Purple Finch**, and **Palm Warbler** at Paul State Forest and a **Sora** at Nazarene Church Rd Wetland on April 24.

Matt Gingerich reported a female **Black Scoter** at the Broadway Wastewater Treatment Plant on April 24. The **Eared Grebe** at the treatment plant continues to be seen and has now molted into breeding plumage.

Ken Ranck had a "yard" **Bald Eagle** at his place in Mt. Crawford on April 25 and has been seeing an **Osprey** along North River.

Congratulations ZIG!

Our very own RBC member, Dr. Charles "Zig" Ziegenfus, was recognized with a newly-established award, the "2021 Valley Treasure," by the Alliance for the Shenandoah Valley. A Valley Treasure is an "outstanding community member that has done more than their fair share to preserve the things we love about the Shenandoah Valley, and multiple folks reached out to let us know Professor Zig fit the bill. In addition to his professional work teaching field ornithology at JMU, Professor Zig has spent decades researching, banding, and tracking migrations and populations of Dark-eyed Juncos, Bluebirds, and White-crowned Sparrows, to name a few. In partnership with Clair Mellinger from EMU at Highland Retreat, he has monitored the migration of the Northern Saw-whet Owl for twenty years. Recently Professor Zig had setup several boxes for American kestrels in eastern Rockingham County and has engaged landowners up and down the Valley to host bird boxes and help with monitoring on their property."

The award presentation was held remotely, via Zoom. It was beautifully done, and included video interviews with people whose lives Zig has touched. Attendees included many of Zig's former JMU students, some of whom shared how Zig inspired them to pursue careers in ornithology and conservation. Congratulations Zig!

9th Annual Raptorthon – Victor Laubach, Coordinator: Rockfish Gap Hawk Watch, Augusta Bird Club

On May 10, our *Rockfish Gap Hawk Watchers* team will conduct our 9th annual Raptorthon! Our team of 5 this year (Vic Laubach, Penny Warren, Rich Wood, Ezra Staengl, and Baxter Beamer) will venture out to spend the day in Highland County, Virginia. Highland County is quite beautiful and

surely has more sheep than people! We did our 2018 Raptorthon here and had a blast, ending with 122 species including 7 raptor species! We aim to break our record this year! We plan to be up before sunrise looking for Whip-poor-wills and owls before spending the day covering as much of the county as possible. We'll likely be out until sunset!
