In this first trip to South America and besides sightseeing, Robyn and Bill planned three day trips with Birdwatching Chile and Rodrigo Reyes. More guides will do day trips, so international travel, even for work or with non-birders, can incorporate a chance to enjoy the natural world and bird watching. This travelogue will take us from sea level to high elevations, from sunny beaches with penguins to the cool Andes with a condor! Robyn has a B.S. in biology from Virginia Tech, and a Ph.D. at the Medical College of Virginia. She is a professor in the Department of Biology and Environmental Science and teaches ornithology some spring semesters as an elective. She enjoys gardening and volunteering as a Virginia Cooperative Extension certified master gardener.

FIELD TRIPS - Diane Lepkowski

** Field trips have been postponed for the foreseeable future due to concerns regarding the coronavirus pandemic.

BIRD SIGHTINGS

Julia Wenger saw and heard a **Long-eared Owl** on a family farm near Bridgewater from Sept. 19-22. Karen Shank also heard the owl during this span, and again about a week and a half later.

Herb Myers reported a Lincoln's Sparrow and a Blue-Headed Vireo in Keezletown on Oct. 28.

Diane Holsinger's first **Dark-eyed Juncos** of the season arrived at her place in Timberville on Oct. 28, her first yard **Purple Finch** arrived on Nov. 22.

Mike Smith reported **Wood Ducks, American Black Ducks**, and a **Winter Wren** at the Merck swamp on Rt. 340 on Oct. 28 and had his first-of-season **Purple Finch** at his feeder east of Elkton on Oct. 29. The following day, Mike had a **Yellow-bellied Sapsucker** and two **Palm Warblers** at his place.

Cory Taylor reported a **Cattle Egret** at the Broadway Wastewater Treatment Plant on Oct. 29. Several birders were able to see the bird throughout the day. On Nov. 1, Matt Gingerich found a **Cattle Egret** at the Oakwood Drive farm pond near Mt. Crawford.

Tom Lord had a very late **Scarlet Tanager** land on the ground five feet away from him at his daughter's home on Shen Lake Drive on Nov. 1. The VSO gold book lists only one other Nov. record for this species in the mountains and valleys region.

Matt Gingerich had three **Dunlins** and three **Bonaparte's Gulls** at the Broadway Wastewater Treatment Plant on Nov. 2.

Bill Benish reported that he and Robyn Puffenbarger had their first-of-season **Purple Finch** at their new place in Verona on Nov. 12.

Mike Smith reported an exceptionally late **Swainson's Thrush** and an **Eastern Phoebe** at his place on Nov. 12.

Karen, Everette, and Annie Shank have had some great birds around their place in Spring Creek, including a **Dickcissel** on Nov. 12 and a late **Nashville Warbler** on Nov. 14.

While birding at the Broadway Wastewater Treatment Plant on Nov. 20, Matt Gingerich spotted a distant group of six **Sandhill Cranes** flying east through New Market Gap.


