PROGRAM: Bedlam on the Beach presented by Pete Myers

Pete Myers of Crozet, VA, will present a program based on his recent article published in the magazine *Natural History*. Pete will share his research, personal observations and incredible photographs of avian life at Point Reyes National Seashore in California. We will learn about the life histories of a wide array of birds from Sanderlings to Long-billed Curlews and the Peregrine Falcons that hunt them.

Pete Myers is founder and chief scientist of Environmental Health Sciences, a non-profit organization that promotes public understanding of advances in scientific research on links between the environment and health. He was a research ornithologist at Philadelphia's Academy of Natural Sciences and a Senior VP for Science at National Audubon. Pete has spent hundreds of hours on the beaches of northern California, taking tens of thousands of pictures of the wild and wonderful birdlife there.

TRIP REPORTS

September Hillandale Walk – Kathy Byers

Sadly, Tom Mizel needed to be out of town for this walk. His good humor and gentle leadership were missed, and this report will be considerably shorter than his wonderful recaps.

The change of season was in the air as the group gathered on a bright, cool morning. We did not have any visitors this trip, but we did enjoy the company of a few folks that aren't able to attend the walks as frequently as us retired folks! The group totaled eleven and a few wish-list birds were suggested. Randy Cline was unable to attend but requested an Olive-sided Flycatcher sighting. Of course, fall warblers were high on everyone's list.

As the group walked to the walnut grove and said their hello's, a few of the usual species started our lists. We were drawn to the calls of Carolina Chickadees, hoping they would have some migrants mixed in with their group. Warblers were not found in the walnut grove, but a flurry of them thrilled and frustrated us further up the hill. Thank goodness we had so many folks able to spot birds, and expert eyes to help us identify them. After seeing lots of underbellies, partial views and serious cases of "warbler neck," eight species of warblers were identified: Cape May, American Redstart, Baybreasted, Blackburnian, Black Poll, Magnolia, Northern Parula and Chestnut-sided. Some of us marveled at the variations in the coloring of birds of the same species. Red-eyed Vireos and a Swainson's Thrush added interest to our lists.

The group decided to skip the bike path and return to the area of small trees along the creek. Eastern Wood-Peewees kept us busy trying to turn them into a species of flycatcher. At least one Empidonax was seen. We were treated to more looks at some of the warblers and the vultures were added to our list. The total for the day was twenty-eight species plus two additional taxa.

BIRD SIGHTINGS

Herb Myers reported 6-10 Common Nighthawks at his place in Keezletown on Aug. 30.

Greg Moyers photographed an **Olive-sided Flycatcher** at Hillandale Park on Sept. 1. Greg reported a **Blue-winged Warbler** at Paul State Forest later the same day. Greg reported another **Blue-winged Warbler** at Paul Forest on Sept. 8.

The Broadway Wastewater Plant has hosted several good birds in Sept. William Leigh reported two **Black Terns** and a **Bank Swallow** on Sept. 1, Greg Moyers reported three **Sanderlings** later the same day, Greg reported an early **American Black Duck** on Sept. 4, Cory Taylor had six **Sanderlings** and a **Baird's Sandpiper** on Sept. 6, and William Leigh reported three **Dowitchers** during the remnants of Hurricane Helene on Sept. 27. Additionally, a reddish-colored teal, originally reported by Matt Gingerich on Sept. 22, has garnered some interest and discussion. The bird is likely a **Blue-winged Teal** with unusual coloration.

Cory Taylor reported two Sanderlings at Turner Sod Farm south of Elkton on Sept. 2.

Diane Lepkowski has had several nice visitors to her yard and water feature near Harrisonburg, including Black-throated Blue Warbler, Least Flycatcher, and a bathing Tennessee Warbler on Sept. 4, American Redstart, Chestnut-sided Warbler, and bathing Black-and-white Warbler on Sept. 14, Cape May Warbler and bathing Scarlet Tanager on Sept. 22, and Cape May, Black-throated Green, and Bay-breasted Warbler on Sept. 28.

Greg Moyers reported a Yellow-bellied Flycatcher at Hillandale Park on Sept. 6.

Greg Moyers, and Mike and Linda Donaldson spotted several warblers at Hillandale Park on Sept. 7, including **Bay-breasted**, **Nashville**, **Canada**, **Magnolia**, **Black-and-white**, **American Redstart**, and **Common Yellowthroat**.

Mike Smith has had some nice yard birds at his place near Elkton, including at least four **Ruby-throated Hummingbirds** on Sept. 12, a **Yellow-bellied Flycatcher** on Sept. 13, a **Swainson's Thrush** on Sept. 18-19, and **Ruby-crowned Kinglet** and **Cape May Warbler** on Sept. 24.

Greg Moyers reported a Philadelphia Vireo at Hillandale Park on Sept. 14.

Cory Taylor reported two **American Golden-Plovers** on Keller Rd west of Dayton on Sept. 15. The following day, Janelle Donaldson found a **Lark Sparrow** at the same location. Several birders were able to see and photograph both birds.

Bill Benish and Robyn Puffenbarger had a **Red-breasted Nuthatch** at their place in Verona on Sept. 16.

Karen Shank reported an adult Golden Eagle at the Shank's place west of Bridgewater on Sept. 16.

Greg Moyes reported a Philadelphia Vireo at Switzer Dam on Sept. 21.

Mike Smith got a photo of a **Ruffed Grouse** during a close encounter near Simmons Gap in Shenandoah National Park on Sept. 23. Mike said the bird appeared to be begging for food and briefly followed them up the trail!

There was an eBird report of four American Avocets at Turner Sod Farm on Sept. 28.

William Leigh reported a juvenile, **Black-billed Cuckoo** at Crist Farm walking Trail in Bridgewater on Sept. 29.
