In late July she heard a bird that seemed unfamiliar to her and on September 12 she finally spotted it. The Shank family has welcomed over 100 visitors, looking to see the first recorded sighting of the Inca Dove in Virginia. As of 10/09/2025, Chelsea has seen it the last 11 days.
